The three permanent 'pissiors' are installed in Newquay to overcome problems of street urination. This follows a trial of three portable 'pissiors' in an effort to ease anti-social behaviour in the centre of Newquay at night which was very successful and as a result, Restormel Borough Council has installed three permanent pissiors called 'Urilifts'.
